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## Message from the president of the RDCA **Thomas Sypkes**

This past year, the RDCA board has seen a few changes that have altered the landscape in our organization. We have seen two key board members step down - Joel Gingrich of Red Deer Polytechnic, whose perspective and passion for the trades shone brightly through his work on the board, and Vic Walls with Border Paving, whose experience and wisdom helped guide the decision-making for many years. We thank these board members for their time and energy, and though they will be missed, it has opened opportunities for new and different perspectives on our board. This past February we welcomed three new board members, Gord Clark with Q&Q Fencing Ltd., Dustin Edey with Emco Waterworks,

and Bruce Martin with Border Paving. We are grateful for their contributions to the work we do and look forward to continuing to work together.

Provincially and nationally, we continue to participate with the Alberta Construction Association, as well as the Canadian Construction Association. It has been excellent to see the RDCA recognized on the national level with our own executive director, Gary Gies, being asked to be a member of one of the National Advisory Councils representing local construction associations. Gary and I were able to participate in Hill Day last November where, once a year, the construction community assembles in Ottawa to have meetings with MPs to discuss

current challenges within the industry. Labour shortages across the nation were a notable concern and we were able to explain these challenges directly to the MPs and discuss possible solutions. We will have an opportunity to do this again in November of 2023 and we are looking forward to continued advocacy and actionable solutions.

Locally, we are fortunate to meet regularly with the City of Red Deer, both with the licencing and inspections department, but also as part of a designated task force made up of City of Red Deer employees and RDCA board members. Both groups are invested in building a relationship focused on finding solutions to improve our community - solutions that work for both the city and the construction industry. Through active participation on both sides, our task force has made many improvements and achieved many of the goals we have set with the support of the city manager. We look forward to growing this relationship and are optimistic that this arrangement can be replicated with other local municipalities.

Various events that the RDCA hosts throughout the year continue to enrich our construction community. In the past year, we hosted our first curling bonspiel. The annual Christmas Breakfast was held early in December and it was attended by 130 people. The event was a great way to connect with members before the end of the year. We also wit-

nessed several organizations being added to our capital projects presentation. The Day of Mourning was recognized near the end of April at Bower Ponds and featured the addition of a new fruit tree. The Golf Classic was held in June at Alberta Springs Golf Course and the weather was exceptional this year. As always, we enjoyed a strong turnout and some friendly competition. Our Annual BBQ was hosted at the RDCA this year and while we needed to reschedule due to inclement weather, we were pleased to host the construction community this past August.

Proceeds and donations from these events have allowed us to award 15 scholarships totaling \$10,000 over the past year. This brings the RDCA's total scholarship contribution to \$163,000, spread across 258 recipients since 2004. We look forward to celebrating the learning and achievements of our apprentices this fall at our Annual Scholarship Awards ceremony.

Connecting RDCA members with project owners and building opportunities via BuildWorks continues to be a large part of what the RDCA does on a daily basis. On average, 3,500 projects are posted throughout Alberta annually. While the RDCA has never stopped providing access to courses and educational content over the past few years, we are pleased to announce that we will be welcoming back in-person classes in our upstairs classroom starting this fall.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your continued support of the RDCA. Without our members and this larger community that we have developed together, we would not be able to provide advocacy, networking opportunities, or education to the level that we have. We are looking forward to continued growth in the year ahead and will continue to be grateful for your

participation in that pursuit.





## Message from the executive director of the RDCA **Gary Gies**

We truly thank you for taking time to read this year's Central Alberta Builder. For over 65 years, the RDCA has had a long tradition in our region, supporting the commercial construction industry and our local community. We are proud to be able to report on our industry locally, and the stories behind the scenes from our many members.



A core priority for the association is to represent and be the voice for our local industry. This exists on many levels, and one in particular has been our advocacy work with our local municipalities and collaborating to improve tendering guidelines. A number of best practices have been implemented over this past year and we are beginning to witness improvements early on in the tendering process, creating better communication all the way throughout the construction phase. Our annual capital projects presentation with our surrounding municipalities continues to grow and is a key information source for the industry. The presentation not only outlines construction projects for the upcoming year, but provides a space for our municipal administrations and industry to collaborate.

With stronger competition these days when bidding on work, the RDCA strives to provide our members with insight information to aid them with project analytics, trends, yearly permit values, as well as trade scope analysis. Our mid- and year-end procurement reports are a centralized focus on construction in our region and is a unique tool for our members looking for industry information and a competitive advantage in Central Alberta.



Over the past year, we have started to witness somewhat of a return to the quantity of work we saw prior to the pandemic. A number of factors are still at the forefront, however, including many municipalities dealing with financial impacts, a stall in private investment with higher interest rates, and material costs and supply chain issues. But likely the largest factor would be the labour and skilled trade shortage. With nearly 15 per cent of the population in our region employed in the construction sector, we are witnessing a shortage of three to five per cent currently and this likely will continue to grow.

Alberta's number-one procurement platform, BuildWorks Canada, remains a viable and valued resource for our industry within the province. In 2023, there have been well over 4,500 projects posted to the platform. The procurement team with BuildWorks Canada was pleased to welcome Sarah Aspinall as operations director in 2023, with aspirations of increasing the experience for our users and overall product interface.


The platform is operated by the eight local construction associations across Alberta along with four in Saskatchewan. The expertise, experience, and connectivity of the associations in each region really brings a strong local industry focus to the program. The associations have a rich history of strong relationships with public and private owners, architects, engineers, suppliers, and contractors to have the most reliable, upto-date information that the industry requires to be successful.

In June, our flagship event, the annual RDCA Golf Classic returned. With over



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



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## RDCA Scholarship Program report



The RDCA's Scholarship Program was established in 2004 to provide support, recognition, and encouragement to our local apprentices to complete their training programs. We are proud to have successfully awarded over \$163,000 to member apprentices since its inception 19 years ago. With over 258 recipients since its inception, the program continues to grow and be recognized throughout the industry as a resource for apprentices to support them in their careers.

This year the association is proud to award 15 scholarships to help towards their ongoing schooling. The scholarship committee of the RDCA awarded three \$1,000 awards, four \$750 awards, and eight \$500 awards. Out of these winners this year, we had representation from seven different trades (Sheet Metal, Plumbing & Gas Fitting, Sprinkler Systems, Refrigeration, Crane Operator, Carpentry, and Electrical), with all attending one of the following schools/organizations: Red Deer Polytechnic, NAIT, or SAIT.

This program is funded through our many events, along with the generous donations from several of our member companies. We want to acknowledge Hawk Custom Sheet Metal and the Parkland Regional Safety Committee (PRSC) for their donations this year. Thank you for your continued support and dedication in investing in our industry's future.







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## **Building Central Alberta - Construction Awards Reception**




#### **Annual Christmas Breakfast**


#### Vic Walls – Legacy Distinction Award



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


### MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER OF INFRASTRUCTURE **PETE GUTHRIE**

I appreciate everything that the members of the Red Deer Construction Association (RDCA) do to move our province forward. I'm looking forward to working with you as we deliver on infrastructure projects that are important to central Albertans.

When it comes to infrastructure projects in Red Deer, top of mind is the Red Deer Regional Hospital Centre, which is being redeveloped to increase patient capacity and improve health care. The \$1.8 billion redevelopment consists of the construction of an ambulatory building, a new patient tower, as well as renovations to the existing hospital main building. This project entered the design phase in June 2023 and construction of the new patient tower and ambulatory building is anticipated to begin in 2025.

Building a modern acute-care hospital takes about 10 years from the start of planning to the end of construction. The Red Deer Regional Hospital Centre redevelopment is one of the largest health care projects that the province





has ever undertaken with construction expected to be complete by 2030 or 2031. We are committed to shortening the timelines where possible.

Alberta's government is committed to providing new and modernized schools in communities where they are needed most. In Red Deer, construction continues to move forward on the modernization of Hunting Hills High School, and I am happy to note that construction has wrapped on the new St. Lorenzo Ruiz Middle School. Doors are open for the 2023-24 school year.

With a budget of over \$200 million, the new Red Deer courthouse is nearing completion and is currently being outfitted with furniture and equipment readying it for opening in 2024.

Ensuring Albertans have the infrastructure in place to support the services they need does not always mean building new. It also means taking good care of existing government facilities with an eye to ensuring environmental sustainability and best use of taxpayer dollars. So, in Red Deer, at facilities such as the Remand Centre, Provincial Building, and courthouse we are investing about \$34 million into 13 capital maintenance and renewal projects. These investments will help to make sure boilers and air handling systems are working effectively, sidewalks and parking lots are safe, windows and exteriors are renewed, and elevators and interiors are upgraded.

Through the federal Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP), Alberta's government continues to advocate for Albertans, while administering and coordinating this federal funding. Construction has already been completed on nine projects, while

work continues on another 18 projects and project bundles in and around Red Deer. These projects are valued at \$114.3 million and support over 600 jobs while improving or expanding seniors and family housing; storm, water, and wastewater systems; trails and sidewalks; and city, recreational and cultural facilities, as well as community outdoor spaces.

This is a great time to be in Alberta. Our economy is growing, and our future is bright. I appreciate the collaboration and contributions all RDCA members are making to help ensure Albertans have the high-quality infrastructure they need, good-paying jobs, and vibrant communities to call home. I look forward to working with you throughout the years ahead.

There was an abundance of construction projects in Red Deer County this past year, and the county stayed the course to champion the transportation routes. As a result, there is steady growth everywhere in our central Alberta region. Red Deer County was presented with the 2022 Project of The Year Award for the Highway 2 and McKenzie Road Interchange Upgrade from the American Public Works Association Alberta Chapter. Construction of the two roundabouts at the McKenzie Road overpass began in May of 2021 and was completed in November of 2021. This project has drastically improved access to and from Gasoline Alley. The APWA Public Works Project of the Year Award was established to promote excellence in the management and administration of public works projects by recognizing the alliance between the managing agency, the consultant/architect/engineer, and the contractor, who, working together, complete public works projects. The Junction 42 area continues to grow with the ad-

vantage of being located along one of North America's busiest travel and trade routes. This highly visible 290 acres is ready for future commercial development and is taking shape to become one of Alberta's most innovative and future-forward business park developments, which originated as a partnership between Red Deer County and the Government of Alberta. This year, the County welcomed the relocation of UFA's Farm and Ranch Supply store and cardlock to a more accessible spot in the hamlet of Gasoline Alley, conveniently located in the southwest corner and easily accessible for drivers travelling either way on the QE2 and those on the west side coming from Highway 2A. All these establishments are key connection points between people, business, and community.




### MESSAGE FROM MLA OF RED DEER-SOUTH **JASON STEPHAN**

shaped the skyline of our downtown and should support the backlog in court cases, as there will be 12 court-rooms with the opportunity to expand to 16 court rooms in the future.

The Red Deer Regional Airport has completed Phase 1 of their expansion, which included widening the runway to accommodate large passenger aircraft. The airport says this will attract new airlines, both passenger and cargo, so that the airport can serve as a

logistics hub. Phase 2 of the expansion has now begun, which includes a new terminal and expansion of the main parking lot. This could turn our airport into a significant economic driver for the region.

Other great projects that are ongoing in our community include the soon-to-be-completed Centre of Excellence for Children and Youth, which will be the new home of the Child Advocacy Centre and other supporting

agencies, as well as the construction of the St. Lorenzo Ruiz Middle School and the modernization of Hunting Hills High School.

### MESSAGE FROM THE MLA FOR RED DEER-NORTH/MINISTER OF HEALTH ADRIANA LAGRANGE

Thank you for this opportunity to provide you with an update on the exciting things that are going on in Red Deer.

The hospital is a big part of what is overall exciting news for the Red Deer region, which is part of a \$3 billion commitment over three years. The Alberta Government knows that this project needs to move forward immediately, and it is.

A total of \$1.8 billion has been committed towards the redevelopment and expansion of the Red Deer Regional Hospital Centre. The transition planning is already underway, and I have spoken with many physicians from the area to learn from them what they consider to be priorities.

Functional planning has been completed in April 2023 and the design phase is now underway with the architecture firm Dialog Design.

Budget 2023 has in its Capital Plan, \$320.6 million over three years towards the project, which will support the largest redevelopment of a major hospital in Alberta's history.

The Functional Program was approved in April 2023 and project planning is now complete. Construction of the main hospital site is expected to be completed by 2031, however, we anticipate the new inpatient tower, as well as the ambulatory care building, will be completed before the completion of the total redevelopment project.

The project will expand inpatient capacity from 370 beds to 570 beds, add three surgical suites plus space to add three more when required in the future, add a cardiac catheterization laboratory, add new medical device reprocessing space, expand ambulatory care capacity, and expand many other clinical programs throughout the hospital.

Planning, designing, and building a modern acute care hospital is a large and complex undertaking that takes





approximately 10 years to complete. Throughout this process, the current Red Deer hospital will remain operational. I can assure you, I'm doing everything in my power to fast track this process, to get this long overdue expansion up and running.

The Red Deer Recovery Community is now open. We were happy to put \$25 million towards this much-needed facility, which was completed and began accepting patients this past April. It accommodates 75 residents at a time, providing the most effective treatment for addiction and mental health disorders.

Those who seek treatment can stay at the facility for up to a year or more if needed, and access services that range from medical detox to programs that help them get their lives back on track through skills development and relationship building, as well as learning about employment, financial, and housing supports.

Treatment is free for all Albertans and is part of a more robust integrated service delivery model for some of our most vulnerable.

Other projects nearing completion include the Justice Centre, Hunting Hills High School major renovations, the Central Alberta Child Advocacy Centre, modernization of the GH Dawe Community Centre which opened in March 2023, and the St. Lorenzo Ruiz Catholic Middle School, which will be opening in September 2023.

I am also happy to report that it is not just Alberta's government that is investing. We've created the investment climate to encourage private developers to make Red Deer a better place to live, work, and play.

It's against that backdrop that I'm especially encouraged by the progress made on the Hazlett commercial lands.

When it's done, it'll be an impressive development of the Major Regional Highway Commercial Centre at the northwest quadrant of the Highway 2 – Highway 11A intersection, with over \$300 million of private investment and approximately 3,000 jobs created.

Annexation into the City of Red Deer is nearing final approval, where you'll see 200 acres of development that will include a variety of major highway commercial uses such as large-format retailers, or what we all call "big box stores", along with everything you'll

need for commercial, hotel space, dining, entertainment, and business.

It seems each year gets bigger and better. We continue to have so much to celebrate in Red Deer and I thank each and every one of you for the positive contributions you make to Red Deer and Central Alberta!





### **CCA** addressing resilient infrastructure and workforce capacity through collective advocacy

Representing 17,000+ member firms, the Canadian Construction Association (CCA) is proud of our mission to inspire a progressive, innovative, and sustainable construction industry.

The key to our collective success is working with valued partner associations like the Red Deer Construction Association. Together, we are driving impactful change on key issues, benefitting not just our industry, but Albertans and all Canadians.

The extreme weather events in Alberta from wildfires to tornadoes and extreme heat and rainfall, underscores the urgent need for increased investment in resilient infrastructure, a capable and sufficient workforce to re-build sustainably, and a place for them to live and contribute to their communities.

An emerging issue is not just the funding of affordable housing, but also the funding of the infrastructure necessary to connect housing to sewers, clean water, roads, and accompanying social infrastructure, such as schools, clinics, fire stations, etc.

#### **Advancing a Canadian Trade Infrastructure Plan**

The industry is gaining traction in its pursuit of more investment in key trade gateways and corridors across the country. Canada's declining reputation as a global trade partner was a top concern at a meeting of premiers and territorial leaders in Winnipeg where I, along with two other coalition partners, made a breakfast presentation on July 12 advocating for a Canadian Trade Infrastructure Plan.

Canada's premiers recognized that trade-enabling infrastructure are an indispensable part of Canada's economic profile - supporting supply chains and the growth of businesses while also helping to fund vital social services and public infrastructure from the revenue earned. They also called on the federal government to convene a First Ministers' meeting dedicated to discussing the priorities of a strategic trade corridor infrastructure federal program and its link to Canada's economic growth and competitiveness.

Alberta is one of Canada's top exporters and stands to benefit from this strategy.

The CCA thanks our coalition partners, which include the Canadian Chamber of Commerce, Canada West Foundation. Canadian Manufactur-

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ers and Exporters, Civil Infrastructure Council Corporation, and Western Canada Roadbuilders, for this important step towards achieving a Canadian Trade Infrastructure Plan.

#### **Workforce remains an urgent** priority

We achieved some headway with the federal government on our collective cornerstone issue to rebuild Canada's workforce through immigration reform. The Department of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship recently announced a new process under the Express Entry program to welcome skilled newcomers with work experience in occupations considered a priority in Canada. Ten occupations in construction, including carpenters, plumbers, welders, and electricians, are included in the list of nearly 83 jobs.

Our collective efforts to make the

workforce shortage issue a priority for the Government of Canada, bringing the message locally, provincially, and federally through our Hill Day and semi-annual Meech Lake meetings, has also generated government support for investing in promotion of the trades and increasing immigration targets to help ease the shortfall.

Conversations will continue, however as the government needs to create a more supportive environment to alleviate the labour choke points that risk crippling Canada's economic growth. This includes changing an outdated immigration point system and working with provinces to ensure better skills matching.

The urgent need for skilled trade workers is also receiving nationwide attention as we work to build the number of apprentices, through our partnership with the Canadian Apprenticeship Service (CAS), and turn construction into a first-choice career, through our industry-wide Talent Fits Here campaign. Within the first six months of the CAS program, millions in funds have been dispersed to eligible employers and 47 per cent of the apprentices self-identified as being from an equity-deserving group.

#### Fair procurement

The value of involving contractors earlier in the project is gaining steam. The CCA obtained a commitment from government leaders at its semi-annual Meech Lake meeting to establish a working group on procurement and project delivery methods. To build the infrastructure needed across the country and recruit the workforce of the future, federal procurement strategies need to adapt to encourage innovation, include contractors earlier in the pro-



cess, account for long-term value and sustainability, promote the use of alternative delivery models, and support shared risk

The CCA continued its summer Standard Practices Tour to learn first-hand from members about their challenges with current procurement practices. With stops at the CCA Annual Conference. Kelowna and Prince Edward Island so far, we learned a lot and reported our findings in October.

CCA's Best Practices Services is delivering new resources - some of which are being developed through the work of our National Advisory Councils. Take a few minutes to watch one of our Read Your Construction Contract webinars at www.cca-acc.com/events/ connected-webinars/past-webinarrecordings/. We are also increasing our outreach to buyers of construction so we can educate them on the benefits of sharing risk and involving contractors early in the project.

#### **Action-backed policies to** support green infrastructure

The CCA is participating in a working group on Canada's Green Buildings Strategy. We are also aligning with our partner associations on our call to governments to update building codes, provide incentives for businesses, share climate data, and create a list of approved "green" materials.

Budget 2023's proposed tax credits in clean technologies and hydrogen are a missed opportunity that we are addressing. Tying restrictive labour conditions to these incentives effectively discriminates against an important segment of the Canadian workforce and. in particular, small- and medium-sized companies. Over the next few months,

the CCA will be reinforcing our budget asks in support of a strong economy through meetings with senior government leaders, a robust outreach strategy, and Hill Day 2023 where the industry will convene to make our message heard in Ottawa.

# Alberta Construction Association update

Alberta Construction Association (ACA) advocacy continues with meetings of key newly appointed cabinet ministers, including Infrastructure, Jobs and Economy, and Immigration. The focus of such advocacy is to demonstrate to government the strong alignment of industry and government priorities.

One such priority is effective Prompt Pay legislation for all projects. The Government of Alberta remains committed to expanding prompt pay to projects under the Public Works Act with the ACA serving on a joint Infrastructure/industry working group providing advice on how best to proceed.

Service Alberta intends to launch consultations this fall on reviewing implementation issues with the current Prompt Pay legislation. The ACA thanks members for providing their experience under the current payment legislation which will inform ACA's input to Service Alberta.

The ACA is very concerned with Service Alberta's proposal to exempt selected megaprojects from prompt pay legislation ostensibly to attract such megaproject investment to Alberta. The ACA forged a coalition of like-minded construction associations to oppose such exemptions. Adoption of changes to invoicing or payment periods adds enormous financial risk to Alberta's construction industry and will take Alberta contractors out of bidding on these projects. Allowing exemptions to prompt pay on one project will inevitably lead to numerous

requests for exemptions on the grounds of competitiveness and affordability, easily impacting projects contractors would normally bid on in their community.

Our coalition of associations urge the Government of Alberta to consider tax, financing, labour relations, and other tools to improve investment attractiveness, rather than supporting major global project investors on the backs of our small construction businesses and their employees. All Albertans benefit from these investments and all Albertans should bear the cost of enhancing Alberta's attractiveness for these investments. We urge a multi-minister task force meet with our organizations for this purpose.

A second advocacy priority is urging government policy and program support to address skill and labour shortages. The ACA continues to advance with government industry proposals to improve apprenticeship training and to speed up immigration.

The ACA appreciates industry uptake of the governmentfunded Trade Pathways program to bring new hires into construction and to upgrade skills through the Construction New Talent Program. The ACA will continue to provide these services in partnership with local construction associations.

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# Improving safety at the COR<sup>™</sup> of the Alberta Construction Safety Association



Implementing safety in the workplace and ensuring safe practices are followed is the main purpose of COR, but there are other benefits to the employer.

The Alberta Construction Safety Association (ACSA) is one of Alberta's longest-standing Certificate of Recognition (COR) $^{\text{TM}}$  and Small Employer Certificate of Recognition (SECOR) $^{\text{TM}}$  certifying partners. Of the 10,500 COR-certified and SECOR-certified employers in Alberta, half were certified through the ACSA.

Matthew Nasby, manager of COR for the ACSA, believes that the orga-

nization's solid reputation comes from providing high-quality services while focusing on continuous improvement.

"Auditing is a snapshot in time... it's an evolution of trying to do better, learning from what has worked, what isn't working, and identifying what you need to do to improve your health and safety management system (HSMS) on an ongoing basis," says Nasby.

The COR certification aims to prove

that a certified auditor has evaluated an employer's HSMS and meets a specific standard. It is in place to ensure a company has a functioning HSMS to improve safety within the organization.

Nasby says that research proves that COR-certified employers have fewer injuries and incidents. Achieving COR is one thing, but employers must also focus on continual improvement and it's important to identify safety gaps in

your organization. The ACSA can work together to get you the support and resources you need to improve. That's another way that they can help, as this is a service they provide to members.

Implementing safety in the workplace and ensuring that safe practices are followed is the main purpose of COR. but there are other benefits to the employer as well. Nasby says that it is proven to reduce workplace injuries. The WCB gives rebates to companies with COR, which can be significant for many organizations. If you're a hiring company, COR reduces risk because you want to work with a contractor with an established HSMS. The ACSA also offers COR for smaller employers. SECOR criteria is like COR, and assessments are evaluated by ACSA - a certifying partner - not by the employer to ensure standards are upheld. At the end of the evaluation, they also provide feedback and recommendations to the employer for continuous improvement.

"The ACSA has another advantage. We have our own audit instrument that we are constantly improving," says Nasby. "We consider the feedback we receive when making improvements. For example, we eliminated some redundant questions and revised the language in the 2023 audit instrument to increase efficiency while maintaining overall integrity. We also adjusted the scoring on several audit components to reflect the employer's activities more accurately."

COR is based on three validation techniques: documentation, interviews, and observations. With the demand for online learning and many organizations requiring distance learning due to their proximity to a training facility, many components of COR and SECOR are available online. Nasby says that the documentation and interviews for COR can be completed remotely. He

adds that the third technique is physical observation, requiring boots on the ground. This is difficult to validate remotely, but because of the pandemic, they have learned how to manage observations remotely if needed.

"The ACSA works collaboratively with our members and industry experts to continuously improve our programs across the construction industry," says Nasby. "We work hard to

maintain the program's integrity while adapting to meet each sector's unique requirements. For example, scaffolding has different needs from the pipeline industry."

# Alberta's construction sector on the road to recovery

Alberta's construction industry saw a robust recovery in 2022 that was fueled predominantly by the residential sector and increasing industrial activity. As in most other provinces, however, this positive news was tarnished somewhat by the inability of the labour force to keep pace with growing demand. This situation may persist as the bulk of older-age workers retire throughout the decade.


In our 2023–2032 provincial labour market outlook, we expect 2023 may see stagnant construction employment as demand for new housing contracts through to 2026. The non-residential sector, meanwhile, is poised to sustain a steady upward trajectory. Major projects spanning road, highway, health care, education, commercial sectors, industrial zones, and public transportation are growing. So too is activity in the oil and gas sector.

Despite the expected residential slowdown easing some recruitment pressures, the extensive non-residential project roster combined with periodic industrial halts and maintenance operations will keep demands high. As a result, we expect that a modest employment growth of two per cent in the non-residential sector will be overshadowed by a 10 per cent decline in the residential sector. These will translate to an overall three per cent contraction in employment over the forecasted period.

#### **Challenges looming**

One of the looming challenges is the anticipated retirement of 38,200 workers by 2032. This figure accounts for approximately 21 per cent of Alberta's 2022 construction workforce. Although Alberta's younger demographics will help to narrow this gap, with around 38,000 new young workers expected to join the workforce, the prov-





ince's labour force nonetheless faces a recruitment gap of approximately 5,100 workers by 2032.

Complicating matters somewhat is the lingering effects of construction's downturn in the late 2010s. Apprentice registrations in several of the province's construction trade programs dropped by 57 per cent between 2014 and 2019. This rate of contraction starkly outpaced the 19 per cent employment contraction over the same period. These declining trends in registration and completion could threaten the supply of new certified workers in several trades by 2032, among them boilermakers, bricklayers, carpenters, and electricians.

# Diversification is key to resolving labour force challenges

The good news is, these challenges are not without solutions. New approaches that focus on diversifying the construction workforce and recruiting workers from three traditionally under-represented groups – women, Indigenous people, and newcomers to Canada – could pay dividends.

Alberta's construction sector employed approximately 37,500 women in 2022. Although that figure represented an increase of one per cent over 2021, just 32 per cent of women employed in the sector worked directly on site. As a share of the total, women made up seven per cent of the province's construction skilled trades workforce.

The Indigenous community paints a brighter picture. Indigenous workers made up 6.7 per cent of Alberta's construction workforce in 2021. That figure is a slight increase from 2016, and is notably higher than the percentage of Indigenous workers employed in the province's overall labour force. Considering the rapid growth of Canada's Indigenous population and their incli-

nation toward work in the construction sector, there may be scope to further increase their recruitment numbers.

Newcomers and immigrants, who currently account for 19 per cent of Alberta's construction labour force, represent another promising group. Given that Alberta is set to welcome an average of nearly 63,900 international migrants each year over the next decade, this demographic could become a cornerstone for labour force expansion.

### Conclusion: opportunities - and challenges - ahead

In conclusion, while Alberta's con-

struction industry is experiencing a post-pandemic recovery, challenges may be on the horizon.

Addressing labour shortages, adapting to fluctuating demands, and diversifying the workforce are critical for the industry's sustained growth and prosperity. With concerted efforts and strategic planning, Alberta's construction industry can navigate these challenges and continue its upward trajectory.





# Red Deer County: Invest with vision



Junction 42 is Red Deer County's newest business campus located midway between Calgary and Edmonton.

Red Deer County is strategically located at the crossroads of major transportation routes in Central Alberta. Gasoline Alley, Junction 42, and the Red Deer Regional Airport are all in Red Deer County. There continues to be endless opportunities for development in our business-friendly industrial parks.

Junction 42 is Red Deer County's newest business campus located midway between Calgary and Edmonton. Situated at the intersection of Highway 2 (QEII) and Highway 42, this area has over 30,000 vehicles passing by each day. The convenient location of Junction 42 allows for businesses to connect to the world with easy access to major international air. rail, and ground transportation routes. Junction 42 is also serviced with high-speed fiber optic Internet cable, giving businesses the very best access to connectivity.

Currently, there are over 290 acres of shovel-ready lands, which include opportunities for developments like current and future fuels such as hydrogen, supply chain for transportation and logistics, food production, agriculture, agritech, and the needs of existing large manufacturers, agriculture equipment, aerospace, and aero-manufacturing.

Also located in Red Deer County is the Red Deer Regional Airport (RDRA) which is eight-kilometres south of the City of Red Deer. The properties immediately adjacent to the Hamlet of Springbrook serve a regional population of 300,000 residents. The RDRA has been working studiously to grow and prosper over the past several years.

The RDRA is a key economic driver for Central Alberta. With direct economic impacts of roughly \$55 million and indirect impacts estimated around \$120 million, the airport is the site for over 20 aviation-related businesses, which together employ over 250 people totaling \$20 million in salaries. The airport facilities can accommodate full air services and are home to a thriving cluster of private aviation-related operations with the capacity for growth and continued development. Among the many aviation businesses housed there, the RDRA is home to a flight school, as well as two major aerial firefighting businesses.

With over \$40 million being invested into the RDRA in the past couple years through the tremendous support from the Province, Red Deer County, and the City of Red Deer, Central Alberta will be one of the only airports in western Canada to offer available and affordable air-side, groundside access for aeronautical/aviation business to locate. The extension of Airport Drive to C&E Trail will open up

200 additional acres of land for development in the coming months. The option for purchase or lease is available for as little as \$2 per square foot and because the RDRA operates as a low-cost business model, they can provide competitive aviation service rates, no business tax, and safe, secure, and efficient service. A new expansion to the existing air terminal will be built to accommodate scheduled international passenger flights. The new development will increase the size of the terminal by 10,000 square feet.

The airport will act as a key anchor for an approach to growth and development with direct access to multi-modal and inter-modal transportation mechanisms for a variety of products, uses, and supply chain solutions.





# Blackfalds unveils the newest jewel: Border Paving Plaza The Border Paving Plaza is a modern, accessible, and assisted cytiender of place in the centre of the community.

Where sports, culture, and community meet, the Town of Blackfalds has once again created a one-of-a-kind gathering space for all walks of life, directly across from the Eagle Builders Centre.

The Border Paving Plaza is a modern, accessible, and aesthetic gathering place within the centre of the community. With its unique appearance, centralized location, and features that encourage togetherness, it has been designed to host markets, festivals, performances, and other community events.

The 14,000-square-foot plaza consists of a large concrete pad, a community firepit, bench seating area, stairs, trails, and landscaping; all illuminated with lighting for evening events. The plaza will also feature a mural wall, depicting recreation amenities and events within the Town of Blackfalds, providing a cultural element to the project.

Almost a year from the day of the construction approval, the plaza was completed in September 2023. The

plaza will enrich the community life of Blackfalds, enhance events at the Eagle Builders Centre, and revitalize the downtown core.

The Border Paving Plaza construction was awarded to Timcon Construction in the amount of \$604,133, with the mural being supplied by the Behrends Group in the amount of \$89,249. Architecture firm Stantec then brought the designs and renderings to town council in March of 2022 for approval.

Mayor Jamie Hoover shared during the approved council meeting that he believes this space will be a welcomed addition to the community.

"I personally believe that this will add some great functionality and continuity in this area for what I think is a minimal cost to the municipality given the amazing grant that we received and the sponsorships that we received," said Hoover. "We gain an area that's appealing and easily used and I'm sure once our community sees this, they're going to understand the benefit it's go-

ing to bring to our community."

The Town was successful in receiving funding for the project through the Federal Government's Canada Community Revitalization Fund in the amount of \$501,000 in 2021. Additional funding for the project was received through community sponsorship from Bording Paving Ltd., DB Bobcats Ltd., Eagle Builders, and STEP Energy Services.

The Town of Blackfalds appreciates the work that Border Paving Ltd. has done within the community and is thankful for their title sponsorship of the plaza. They are also grateful for the support from local businesses for their generous contributions to this project.

While construction is still being completed, the Town is excited to bring the community even closer with this space, and is looking forward to announcing its completion.



# **Enhancing emergency response**

Red Deer's new 911 Emergency Communications Centre and Emergency Operations Centre empowers rapid response and community protection

In the face of emergencies, every second counts. With unwavering determination and cutting-edge technology, the completion of the Red Deer 911 Emergency Communications Centre last year marked a transformative milestone in emergency response in the region.

The Red Deer 911 Emergency Communications Centre (ECC) and Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) is responsible for dispatching fire apparatus and answering 911 calls for Red Deer and a large portion of Central and Southern Alberta. The former facility that accommodated the centres was undersized, and was combined and divided between various city departments and facilities. It was at a point where they were growing too fast and it was no longer suitable for their needs. As a result, the City went into a competitive bid process to renovate and update the centre to meet the future service demand.

"The Red Deer 911 ECC is responsible for answering 911 calls for about 450,000 Alberta residents currently in 70 different municipalities and they dispatch out 70 different departments. We do that with up to seven staff on shift at a time," says Matt White, acting deputy chief for the City of Red Deer Emergency Services. "Right now, we can accommodate all seven staff plus we do have room for surge events,

or large-scale events when our call volume spikes due to different types of events going on in any one of those communities we serve. Between the new centre we have here and the secondary one we operate, we can staff up to fifteen 911 and dispatch positions to serve those surge events."

Construction started on the new facility, which is housed in a former firehouse, in February 2021 after a feasibility study was done in 2020. Throughout construction they maintained an active secondary centre and the 911 staff operated in that as their primary centre for the year of construction.

Once the secondary centre was set up, construction got started at the firehall. The new ECC is located in a twostorey firehall and houses a number of emergency services functions, including administration, fire prevention, the 911 emergency communications centre, and IT support for Emergency Services. Timcon Construction Ltd., the general contractors on the project, started by demolishing the two apparatus bays, which is where the fire trucks previously parked, and then did some shoring and underpinning of the existing foundations to help facilitate the growth and expansion of the new structure. They also expanded the second floor to give them more usable space since there are multiple services running out of the building.

The total budget for the project was \$6.5 million, with a total construction budget of \$5.7 million. It was partially funded though the City of Red Deer and through the federal government. Since the construction occurred through the COVID-19 pandemic, they were able to apply for the Investing in COVID-19 Community Resilience Grant, which ended up funding the bulk of the project.

There are about 40 kilometres of power and data cable that run throughout the building to support the phone lines, and all of that data comes in and out of the centre every day. Timcon Construction ended up building the centre on a raised floor so all of the heating, ventilation, air conditioning, and power and data run underneath the floor and is accessible through a removable panel. White says that if they need to add desks or change lay-

outs, they are able to do that easily and it all comes up underneath the desks, so there are no wires from above and nothing to trip on. Every station that the dispatchers use also has its own climate control and is adjusted by the individual dispatcher.

The previous facility had room for all seven staff, but White says it was tight and it had far exceeded what was comfortable in the space. The acoustics in the room were also bad and it was difficult for the 911 operators to hear. Part of the process prior to moving the ECC staff out to the new centre was to get an engineer to come in and measure the decibel levels and see what they were at in the old space and then use that data to design acoustics for the new space.

"It made a world of difference," says White. "We have had an exceptionally busy fire season in Alberta; we have seen unprecedented wildfires and the call volume in that centre is at times twice what it would normally be. So, we have been able to bring people in to support that call volume and they have reported that it maintained a good acoustic sound. We have staffed up in there, so we have had up to eight or nine people working at a time and the acoustics have been excellent. They have been able to have conversations between themselves, everyone had their radio going, but the decibel level doesn't increase like it used to

and it makes it really functional for our folks."

The desks also feature a built-in HVAC system to keep operators cool and tempered, as well as the capacity to raise up and lower down to the comfort level of the operator.

The facility also features a tempered air system. Kerry Boothe, president of Timcon Construction Ltd., says that they wanted a lot of natural light to be able to access the area, and a big part of upgrading their window systems was the use of ballistic glass.

"We had to achieve a certain design parameter for emergency response facilities in Canada, and what that involved was the use of [ballistic] glass

in some areas, not all the areas, but the critical areas," says Boothe. "We also had to design a blast wall that is located in front of the facility. It's an element that, if anything ever happened outside, you had to protect the heart of the 911 dispatch... if a tornado decided to happen outside the front the door, that wall would protect the facility."



Since it was a construction management project, there were a number of contractors involved in the design of the project. Group2 Architecture and Interior Design did the architecture and interior design, KB Engineering Ltd. were involved with the mechanical and electrical, and Sveinson Consulting Engineers Ltd. did the structural portion of the project. Boothe adds that Farion Architectural Acoustics Inc. did some of the acoustic applications inside the ECC room to eliminate any sound reverberations.

"They were very adamant that the inside of the operating room had to be very quiet," says Boothe. "When [the operators] receive a phone call, it could be the worst day of someone's life. They have to be attentive to what [the callers'] needs are, and it's their administrative job that they set [the caller] on the right trail."

The project was broken up into phases so the construction team could work around the secondary centre that was set up. Once the primary centre was complete, operators and staff could move into it and the construction team then fixed the renovations where the secondary centre was set up. White says that their biggest challenge was maintaining a functional 911 call centre throughout the course of construction.

The new Red Deer 911 Emergency Communications Centre and Emergency Operations Centre has been operating now for over a year and has been able to serve the needs of the community in a more efficient manner for years to come.

"When people call 911, we have trained dedicated folks here that answer that call 24/7, 365 days a year. It's a mission-critical environment and we now have a building in a centre that will serve the needs of emergency services and the needs of the community for the next 15 to 20 years," says White, who adds that they also built growth into the facility as technology changes. "The whole country is moving towards next-generation 911, which means replacing all the copper phone lines that 911 currently runs on with data cable and IP lines, so we now have a centre that keeps up with that as the technology changes. We are in a really good position to future-proof ourselves and the community so we can provide reliable 911 dispatch services for years to come."

# St. Lorenzo Ruiz Middle School opens in Red Deer

A new middle school is set to open for the 2023/24 school season in the Kentwood neighbourhood in Red Deer.

The St. Lorenzo Ruiz Middle School broke ground in March 2022 and is a Grade 6 to 9 school in the northwest area of the city. The project is part of the Red Deer Catholic School Division and was built after being approved for \$29.3 million in capital funding by the Alberta Government. The division indicated that their middle school student population in Red Deer has been over 100 per cent capacity in each of their two existing middle schools and a partial kindergarten to Grade 9 school.

"We have been full for the last few years and the Alberta Government decided that we were one of the top projects in the province, so we got funding for that," says Rod Steeves, secretarytreasurer for the Red Deer Catholic School Division. "Initially the funding was just for design in Budget 2019, and then within a year after we had done all the design, we got final funding from the government in Budget 2021 to actually construct the school."

two-storev approximate 71,000-square-foot school can accommodate 750 students and features 28 learning spaces, 19 of which are classrooms. There is a multicultural area, as well as a number of Career and Technology Studies (CTS) spaces. One of these spaces is for millwork, which will also be prominent in the multicultural area, where students will be able to create artifacts that represents different cultures that are within the building.

"In front of that millwork, which is

embedded within our upstairs rail, we will have panels that are put in front of the millwork which can be seen down from the gathering area on the bottom floor," says Rob Coumont, principal at St. Lorenzo Ruiz Middle School. "Students can design those panels through our design education classes with the use of our laser cutter and then switch them in and out."

The school will also feature a garage door that opens up to an outdoor compound so the shop can be inside or outside. They will also have a foods lab and an arts classroom where half of the classroom is windows that look down onto the gathering area and across from the multicultural learning space.

St. Lorenzo Ruiz Middle School will be great for students looking to learn more about digital arts as it will also have an e-Sports CTS class which will feature 28 high-end computers which are on desks so they can be rolled into the learning commons if they have tournaments. The whole front of the learning commons are windows and the doors slide open to reveal four 75-inch TVs that are a video wall.

Just off the learning common there is a green-screen podcast room that can be used through the learning common or can be used for leadership.

The school also features 836 solar panels on the roof and has a solar TV in the main gathering area which charts the solar panels so students can look it up and use it in their classrooms if they choose.

Clark Builders were the general contractors on the project with Group2 Architecture and Interior Design doing the design. Other contractors who worked on the project include KTJ Consulting (owners agent), Read Jones Christoffersen Ltd. (structural designer), WSP Canada Inc. (electrical/mechanical designer), KERR Interior Systems Ltd. (drywall/steel stud builder), AltaPro Electric Ltd. (electrical builder), World Class Contracting (mechanical builder), and Collins Industries Ltd. (structural steel builder).

The project was built using the Integrated Project Delivery (IPD) delivery method, which is a method in which all key parties, including owner, architect, and builder, are involved in all stages of the construction process. Steeves says that they have had a lot of success using IPD in the past having built two schools and an upgrade to a school using the IPD approach. Curtis Kushnerik, superintendent at Clark Builders, mentions that they also utilized Lean principals and the use of the Last Planner System, which is a system that promotes the creation of a predictable workflow among various parties

# We're shaping the future of Red Deer

### 91 acres between city and nature never looked so promising.

Capstone, a meticulously designed development located at the heart of Red Deer, is poised to elevate the city's status as one of the most sought-after places to live and work in the province.


Nestled along the riverside, Capstone offers a prime and accessible living experience, boosted by a \$45 million dollar investment by The City and complemented by its proximity to the \$1.8 billion regional hospital expansion. This mixed-use, master-planned community embraces the vision of a walkable urban neighbourhood by showcasing best-in-class planning concepts and smart design aesthetics—a desirable prospect for many Albertans.

Beginning in January 2023, the Capstone project team initiated a direct marketing campaign to identify capable investors and developers interested in Capstone's vision. Over 100 qualified developers were contacted, resulting in an enthusiastic response where numerous expressions of interest were generated. This marks an exciting step in the development's progress and signals the next phase of the master plan vision—vertical construction.

so it achieves a reliable result.

Although the team was able to complete the project in July 2023, they did run into a few challenges along the way. Tyler Gagnon, project coordinator for Clark Builders, says that they were supposed to start the project in the fall of 2021 but it was delayed to spring of 2022, which resulted in them having a pretty aggressive schedule to complete the job on time. He credits the IPD, Lean construction principals, and the Last Planner System for being able to efficiently complete the project. They also ran into some unforeseen conditions related to the soils which also pushed it back a month.

Another major challenge was in December 2022 when it was indicated that another school was running at maximum capacity in their Foundations program, which is designed to meet the needs of diverse learners, and it was decided that the program would be moved into St. Lorenzo Ruiz. Kushnerik says that they made a quick change to three different classrooms to be able to accommodate the Foundations program, moving it from the other school into this school.

"They had the capacity in the zoning to be able to have that program here. We had to revamp the science room into a special classroom with a small residential kitchen inside of it and alter the bathrooms. With the change in the program, it also meant there would be an increase in staff, roughly 30 extra people," Kushnerik says. "We needed to alter the staff areas as well to accommodate extra washrooms. It was a major change that the group was able to do and still hit our handover period."

Although there were a number of hurdles in completing the school, it successfully opened to middle school students this past September.

"It's more important than just Catholic education in the area. Where it's situated means that kids won't have to bus quite as far or walk as far," says Steeves. "The two schools that are our main middle schools are in the southern part of Red Deer. This will give us a chance to have kids go to a school in the northern part of the city."

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# Helping vulnerable children and youth in Central Alberta

The Centre of Excellence, home of the Central Alberta Child Advocacy Centre, opens in Red Deer

In a ground-breaking initiative to protect and support Central Alberta's most vulnerable, a new first-of-itskind Centre of Excellence is coming to Red Deer

The centre, which started construction in August 2022, is a beacon of hope, providing comprehensive services for children, youths, and families who have experienced abuse, neglect, and/or sexual exploitation. Constructed by Eagle Builders, the Centre of Excellence has been thoughtfully designed to create a child-friendly environment that fosters healing, collaboration, and hope.

The Centre of Excellence, located on the main campus of Red Deer Polytechnic, is a 69,000-square-foot, three-storey building that brings together key partners in child advocacy, mental health, and addiction. These partners include the Central Alberta Child Advocacy Centre, the Central Alberta Sexual Assault Support Centre. Alberta Health Services: Red Deer Child and Youth Addiction and Mental Health Outpatient Clinic, the Step Up, Step Down youth live-in mental health program, and the Move Your Mood Studio.

The project came about after an epidemic of teenage suicides in Red Deer.

"We started a coalition after the tragic loss of Lindsey More. We gathered as a community and said that there needs to be better, faster access to resources," says Mark Jones, CEO of the Central Alberta Child Advocacy Centre (CACAC). "Sheldon Kennedy [former NHL player and victim of sexual abuse] suggested we build

a child advocacy centre and then we can expand and get mental health and addictions support in the building as well. Over the last six years we have worked with government agencies, Red Deer Polytechnic, and other service organizations to get all these people into the building together."

The \$23-million building features offices for the partners, as well as family-friendly spaces to create an environment for children, youth, and families to feel comfortable and safe in. In addition to their independent spaces, the building also includes 41 therapy rooms that can hold sessions every

hour, as well as an all-season patio for the staff. Spaces like boardrooms are not reserved to any particular agency in the building, allowing for the partners to share the space, further freeing up room in the building for spaces like therapy rooms.

The facility itself is a blend of conventional cast-in-place and modern engineering practices with prestressed, pre-cast concrete panels that were poured locally at the Eagle Builders facility in Blackfalds and then transported to site in segments where they were then erected with cranes. Brett Reynolds, project manager at

Eagle Builders, says that the walls also have a large amount of thermal mass and a good U-value, which will allow the building to heat and cool gradually throughout the day and make the building more energy efficient. Reynolds adds that they are also installing solar panels on the steel and PVC membrane roof which aligns with the Red Deer Polytechnic Green Campus Plan.

The building, designed by PLACE Architecture, is quite unique and intentionally designed to provide visual interest and maximize the natural scenery and landscaping around the

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building. According to Reynolds, the building features a "circuit board" design which symbolizes the interconnectedness of the different components of the building and the organizations that will call the Centre of Excellence home.

"We went through several iterations of the design on the exterior," says Reynolds. "Once the building shape was decided, we used different colours to make the building more modern. We wanted to represent what's going on in the inside and the direction that the building is going. Each colour, the large impactful bright colours, to us represents the different organizations within the building. The dark blue lines tie everything and everyone together and represents the interconnectedness throughout."

A lot of care and attention went into designing the building, including the use of data and studies that referenced designs for working with patients dealing with mental health. For example, Reynolds noted that initially the front reception desk had been designed with some vertical slabs in white marble that would typically be seen as a premium upgrade - similar to what one might see at an upscale hotel. When the design team and frontline workers saw it. they felt it was too similar to prison bars, and that it could potentially trigger visitors or families.

The fact that the centre was built at the Red Deer Polytechnic campus was also strategic.

"The great thing about it is that you have all these future health care nurses, potential doctors, social workers, teachers, lawyers, judges, and police officers working and going to school there," says Jones. "So, with us working with the polytechnic, we are creating courses and certificates that the polytechnic can use. Hopefully we can get all the other colleges and universities on-side, and they will start to implement these programs as well."

Jones adds that there will be many practicum opportunities and workintegrated educational experiences in the Centre of Excellence as a direct result of their relationship with Red Deer Polytechnic. Red Deer Polytechnic has already begun the implementation of work-integrated practices in curricula in relation to the Centre of Excellence.

Other RDCA members who worked on this building include Civic Mechanical Ltd., Phase 3 Electric Ponoka Ltd., Thermo Pro Insulation and Drywall, Central Alberta Tile One Inc., and Pidhernev's Inc. Jones adds that most of the trades that worked on this project ended up donating back a portion of their fees from the work.

"Eagle Builders is pleased to have been a part of this project," says Reynolds. "The building envelope is constructed with robust materials which will provide children, their families, frontline workers, and all other key partners a space designed to last for generations."

The new Centre of Excellence is a much-needed space and will be the first-of-its-kind in North America. As the demand for services like those offered in the Centre of Excellence rises, it is initiatives like these that give some hope to the survivors.

"It shows our vulnerable kids and their families that they aren't alone in their journey, and that they have the proper resources and supports in one place," says Jones. "It will make a monumental difference in their lives."

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# Revolutionizing education

The Werklund Agriculture and Technology Centre modernizes Olds College for tomorrow's AgTech leaders

A new learning facility opened at Olds College of Agriculture & Technology last year.

The Werklund Agriculture and Technology Centre officially opened its doors to students in September 2022 and is a modern facility that is designed to enhance the student experience through high-tech learning spaces. The centre, which is home to the Werklund School of Agriculture Technology programs, including the

college's new Bachelor of Digital Agriculture degree, is housed in an existing building that was modernized and expanded.

"The college recognized several years ago the need for a state-of-the-

All photos courtesy of Chandos Construction. art facility due to the expanding fields of agriculture technology," says Tom Ranieri, director of campus development and facilities. "Rather than starting from scratch, we explored the potential of the James Murray building, a structure that required significant upgrades. Our goal was to transform it into a modern facility that could accommodate the growing number of students and staff while providing high-tech learning spaces."

Construction on the 45,000-square-foot centre started in January 2021 and was completed in July 2022. The total construction cost was around \$11 million, with half being funded by donors and the college, and the other half from Government of Alberta grants. The facility is a combination of both the 30,000-square-foot existing building – which was completely renovated – and a 15,000-square-foot expansion.


The single-storey building features a main atrium with three maker/lab spaces across the front of the building,

as well as 16 classrooms, and breakout rooms and study spaces. The classrooms are sub-dividable, meaning they can become eight larger classrooms since each one is twinned with another classroom with a demountable partition in the middle. Ranieri says that a typical layout would be 15 students per class, or you could expand it to 30 or 60 by raising the movable partition.

The three maker/lab spaces are able to accommodate different programming needs. One of them, the mechatronics lab, is able to house equipment which can be driven into the building so students can work on the mechanics and electronics on various pieces of equipment. Another space is a greenhouse technology research lab and the third one is an electronics research lab.

The mechatronics lab features a 20-high-by-20-foot-wide glass hangar door which looks like a sliding barn door.

"It's a very unique feature. Most people don't realize it's a sliding door until

you point it out because it looks like the rest of the glass curtain wall across the front of the building," says Ranieri.

The facility also features 16 breakout rooms and study spaces for students to do collaborative work. There is also a large lecture hall which can accommodate up to 125 occupants, which features raised seating, as well as staff and office space for around 34 staff members. Lastly, the building has a big atrium space which runs north to south in the building which is a general gathering space for students and

The atrium itself is an architectural feature since it is made from gluelaminated timber with glue-laminated planks which make up the ceiling and roof of the space. On the west side there is also a curving row of clerestory windows which fills the space with natural light.

Since the construction team was working with the original structure of the 1960's building, they had to take out all the existing mechanical and electrical systems and upgraded everything to new systems to modernize the facility. The building now features high-energy-efficient HVAC systems, triple-glazed windows, and a super-insulated building envelope. Ranieri adds that they did some initial energy modelling for the new building and it was determined that this new centre would use much less energy than the original

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Since they were working with an older building, there were some challenges tying in the new structure with the old one.


"Anywhere we had foundation that were connecting, steel that was connecting, glue-lams that were connecting, nothing matched up perfectly, so probably the biggest challenge were opening those sections up," says Ben Steenbergen, project manager at Chandos Construction, the general contractors on the project. "We were able to do some 3D modelling with our Chandos BIM team and survey and model out how to connect them prior to the materials coming. The biggest challenge was just making sure that everything connected properly and matched up and all the atriums matched up throughout the building."

Other RDCA members who worked on this project include Olds Concrete Services (2014) Ltd., Appollo Landscaping Ltd., Q-2 Electrical Contractors Ltd., Cen-Con Concrete Inc., Westar Masonry (1988) Ltd., Block-Tech Industries Ltd., Red Deer Overdoor, and ASK Environmental.

The modernization of the facility also included updating a water tower that was on site right next to the building. Steenbergen says that the water tower was built around 1917 and had cedar shakes on it that had carvings from the town that dated back to 1927, including dates and names of the community members. They were able to keep the cedar shakes and give them back to the college, which is now displayed for the community to see.

The Olds College Werklund Agriculture and Technology Centre welcomed their first intake of students last September and both the users and college are proud of the building and what it offers.

"We have toured so many people



# **Taking flight**

Red Deer Regional Airport soars to new heights with expansion project





In a bid to reshape Alberta's skies, the Red Deer Regional Airport is spreading its wings with an ambitious expansion project set to redefine regional aviation.

The Red Deer Regional Airport is currently undergoing a three-phase airport expansion project, which will ultimately allow the region to attract larger aircraft and new business development opportunities.

Phase 1 of the project included a \$15 million runway expansion from 30 metres to 45 metres, while also strengthening a main taxiway and apron. The project was completed in spring 2023 and will allow the airport to attract larger aircraft, such as those commonly associated with low-cost airlines, and cargo operators.

Phase 2, which started construction in September and is scheduled to be completed by next summer, includes an expansion to the existing terminal, which will see it increase in size from 4,000 to 14,000 square feet. The expansion will enable the airport to support and enlarge the passenger service opportunities and attract 737s, Airbus 320-type aircrafts.

Phase 3 of the project is a \$30 million extension to Airport Drive from the south of the airport to the north, which will allow the airport to access approximately 200 acres of prime airside real estate. This phase of the project will support cargo, aircraft maintenance and repair, as well as aircraft manufacturing opportunities and more aviation/aviation-related businesses.

The Phase 2 expansion, which is currently under construction, is based on the low-cost terminal concept. The building will be practical and facilitate the leeway of passengers. There won't be any restaurants, but will feature a micro café and vending machines.

"It's really all about a low-cost terminal concept, which is essentially the first in Canada to undertake this type of design," says Graham Ingham, CEO of the Red Deer Regional Airport. "At the end of the day, as a low-cost airport, it's really important that we play our part in making air traffic affordable. Currently, we do not charge airport improvement fees, and we also offer free parking, which is almost unheard of these days. This is a new concept to Canada, so we're pretty excited to get this done."

The Red Deer Regional Airport currently doesn't offer passenger service, but is hoping to attract low-cost carriers, as well as cargo, aircraft manufacturing, and aircraft maintenance repair. Right now, they accommodate charters, private jets, and aircraft that are in support of the oil patch. Currently the terminal is only capable of supporting 30 passengers, and in order to be able to capitalize on the opportunities that are available with the low-cost carriers, they had to expand by 10,000 square feet to serve another 189 passengers.

Because of its attractive location between Edmonton and Calgary, Ingham says that low-cost carriers are interested in offering service out of Red Deer in the future. The route will most likely fly direct to other smaller regional airports such as Abbotsford, Hamilton, as well as Caribbean locations in the winter months. He adds that Red Deer also has the goal to be the number-one event destination in Alberta by 2030, which is difficult to do if there is no passenger service.

Although attracting low-cost carriers to the airport is part of the overall plan for the expansion, a big focus is also on the opportunities that they have with land development.

"We have 200 acres beside our main runway that really no other airport in Canada has, and at a really affordable price as well," says Ingham. "That's where we talk about Phase 3, driving the main road from the south of the airport to the north; that's where we can access all that land, create hundreds of jobs, and get the tax revenue. That's the big driver in all of



this."

Phase 2 of the project was awarded to Timcon Construction Ltd. It is budgeted at \$3.5 million and is being funded by the airport itself. At time of publication they were finalizing the design and layout for the terminal and hoped to do an open house and public announcement in September.

Since the terminal was previously renovated in 2019, Nancy Paish, director of business development and communica-

tions for the Red Deer Regional Airport, says that their goal is to expand on the sustainable features that are currently in the building.

"We are looking at a lot of technology we can implement, so working with some of the companies that can do more of a digital advertising component in there," says Paish.

The Red Deer Regional Airport expansion project is set to be fully finished by 2026. Not only will it help attract more business and visitors to Red Deer in the future, but the project is also an economic driver for the region since it will create hundreds of jobs, not just during construction, but once the airport is complete as well.

"At the end of the day, airports are economic drivers. There's lots of opportunities to create hundreds of jobs here and generate tax revenue for the community and social programs," says Ingham. "The Province likes what we are doing here and sees tremendous opportunities as a transportation and logistics corridor. From a communications perspective, it's all about jobs, whether it's construction jobs, full-time, part-time, it's an opportunity as businesses come along for us to partner with other organizations in Red Deer and Central Alberta."

# Bartle & Gibson opens new Triangle Supply shop in Red Deer

Back in 2019, Bartle & Gibson orchestrated the acquisition of Triangle Supply, which was a strategic integration borne out of admiration for the company's impressive achievements. Since then, this collaboration has taken their already successful business model and built upon it.

"We decided to purchase [Triangle Supply] four years ago and grow the business. We have expanded our inventory along with our sales, technical, and customer service team to the point that we outgrew our previous location, so we decided to move into a bigger one," says Martin Lower, president and CEO of Bartle & Gibson. "We believed strongly in the Central Alberta market so we wanted to invest in a first-class building to service the market since we

think there is a good opportunity there.

Construction began on the approximate 48,000-square-foot building, located at 7550 Johnstone Drive, last year and was completed in April 2023. The building includes a 40,000-square-foot warehouse and showroom, located on five acres. The company chose the northwest area of the city since they thought it would be a good location due to it being right off the QEII Highway, therefore making it easy to get to and from anywhere in Red Deer.

The \$7.5 million building is made from precast concrete with 28-foothigh ceilings. It also has a paved two-acre yard. Inside there is a showroom, office space, and counter area. It also has in-floor heating, which is something that Lower says is unique to this

particular location. Since the company specializes in this service, it was something that they felt was important to incorporate to show clients how the product works.

"We actually made it an actual display room where all the hydronic heating is done, which is kind of unusual," says Lower. "People can go in there and see how the hydronic heating works."

Camdon Construction were the general contractors on the project. Other RDCA members who worked on this project include Sash Developments, ATEK Developments Inc., Cen-Con Concrete Inc., Central Alberta Tile One Inc., Civic Mechanical Ltd., Goodmen Roofing Ltd., Q&Q Fencing Ltd., Red Deer Overdoor, J.T. Setters & Sons Construction Ltd., Real Enterprises Ltd., and Western Painting & Decorating (1999) Ltd.

they did run into issues with the storm water management. Lower says that since the area is all sand, going down around 10 feet or so into the ground, it ended up eroding quite quickly. Because of that, they did have to do a lot of mitigation to manage the water.

The new Triangle Supply shop has been open in the Red Deer area since spring and residents have had a good response to the new location. Lower adds that this new location will offer more products for customers that want them.

"It's been very positive. People are very excited to have a new big facility because we can carry a lot of products they need," says Lower. "People are really excited about it and it's going to allow us to expand into markets that we weren't as active in before."


